



## Urology Clinical Telemedicine Consultations

The following is a listing of clinical conditions appropriate for clinical telehealth urology consultations. If you would like to refer a patient with a condition which is not listed below, please send your request with that patient's chart notes to the telehealth coordinator for the specialist's consideration

### **Clinical Conditions:**

Bladder Outlet Obstruction  
Hematuria  
Urinary Incontinence  
Urologic malignancies  
Urinary stones  
Urinary Tract Infections  
Scrotal Masses  
Phimosis  
Cryptorchidism (Undescended Testicle)

### **Necessary Clinical Information Includes:**

Complete H&P, Relevant family/social history  
Pertinent outside records, documentation of previous urological evaluation  
Current medications, allergies & drug levels  
Summary of patient's course regarding urological issues- frequency, severity and response to interventions  
Copy of PCP initial intake & follow-up evaluation pertaining to problem prompting referral indicating his/her impression, plan & specific questions

### **The following if available:**

Report of labs or diagnostics i.e. UA/UC, Serum creatinine, PSA, CT Urogram, Renal U/S, Scrotal U/S, KUB

### **Appointment Scheduling:**

New: 60 minutes  
F/U: 30 minutes

### **Level of Presenter Required:**

May include a brief introduction from the Primary Care Provider and/or discussion of condition and treatment

### **Video Equipment Required:**

Videoconferencing unit

### ***The following information must be received prior to scheduling an appointment:***

1. Telehealth Referral Request Form
2. Necessary clinical information listed in column on left

### ***The following must be received before the consult begins:***

1. Signed NCTP Acknowledgement of Receipt: Notice of Privacy Practices form (new patients only)
2. Documented verbal consent from patient for participation in telehealth consultation.
